The Ministry of Environment, Climate Change and Technology in partnership with UNICEF and other UN agencies, are organizing a 'Multistakeholder Consultation with Young People on Climate Action' in the Maldives during 12 October 2022. This event is organized as a precursor to the 27th Session of the Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC- COP27), in Egypt.

The event will see the attendance of 150 representatives composed of young people from the Maldives, government institutions, UN agencies, private sector and other stakeholders. The participants will discuss the impact of climate change in Maldives, and listen to young people for more insights into the current situation.

Prior to the consultation, on 11 October 2022, young people will be oriented on climate issues and will come out with a young people's statement on Climate Action to be presented in the COP27 in Egypt.

The event will build on the experience of last year where the Government of Maldives, in partnership with UNICEF and UNDP, organized a pre-COP26 event where adolescents and young people from SIDS participated and voiced their opinions on climate change including work they have done in their communities as part of climate action. During COP26, the Government of Maldives was a key advocate for child rights and climate action, speaking in various panels including COP 26 panel for children and COY21.
