1	<p>discrepancy between the defined scope of work and the listed indicative tasks and deliverables. Specifically, <i>task "#4 - Establish the main indicators for the Communications Strategy of the Monitoring and Evaluation (M&E) Framework based on the data collected"</i> - is listed under the Indicative Tasks and Deliverables section; but does not appear to be explicitly reflected within the Scope of Work.</p> <p>To ensure alignment with the requirements of the assignment, I would appreciate your confirmation on whether this task is intended to be part of the Scope of Work for this assignment.</p>	<p>While this task is not separately itemized in the Scope of Work, it is considered an integral part of the assignment. Specifically, it is understood to be a natural extension of the baseline survey, stakeholder mapping, and readiness assessments outlined under the Scope. The indicators form a critical link between the data collected and the Communications Strategy and are essential for fulfilling the objective of the consultancy.</p> <p>Additionally, this task is clearly captured in the Deliverables & Payment Schedule section of the TOR (Page 42), where it is assigned a dedicated deliverable and payment milestone. This confirms its inclusion within the expected output. Therefore, Task #4 is indeed intended to be part of the assignment's scope and should be addressed accordingly in your technical proposal.</p>



2	Is there a specific sample size or sampling locations predetermined or does the sample size for the baseline survey needs to be a nationally representative sample size?	<p>The Terms of Reference do not stipulate a fixed sample size or predetermined sampling locations for the baseline survey.</p> <p>The proposed baseline survey must be methodologically robust and adequately representative of the various stakeholder groups and geographic contexts relevant to the project.</p>
