#	Clarification required	Answer
1	What types of hazardous waste data have been collected, and is data collection complete?	The collected data includes the identified categories of hazardous waste, along with, where applicable, their respective quantities or generation rates, storage conditions, locations, and responsible jurisdictions.
2	In what format is the data stored (Excel, CSV, GIS, scanned forms, etc.)?	The collected data are in digital format, predominantly stored in Excel files.
3	Are metadata or data dictionaries available to describe variables?	The methodology (data collection) and key definitions have been developed and documented.
4	Are historical or baseline datasets available for trend analysis?	A compiled historical or baseline dataset is currently unavailable, which limits direct comparability with the current datasets of interest under this consultancy.
5	How will data be accessed (secure transfer, on-site, or remote)?	The data will be made available via a cloud-based platform.
6	Will access include raw datasets or only compiled summaries?	The raw datasets will be made available.
7	Are there confidentiality or permission requirements for certain data sources?	Yes, unless the data has already been published or made publicly accessible, confidentiality or permission requirements apply.
8	Will supporting datasets (e.g., customs, facility records, imports/exports) be shared?	Yes, access to the available supporting datasets will be provided.



9	Has the existing data been verified or validated by any authority?	The data has been collected from the Ministry and relevant stakeholders through official channels of communication.
10	Are there known data gaps or inconsistencies?	Details of uncertainties, data gaps, and assumptions will be provided.
11	Will the consultant be expected to conduct additional data verification?	The consultant is expected to conduct data verification using statistical analysis.
12	Are there national or UNDP/GEF standards for data cleaning and validation?	No specific standard is required to be followed. However, the consultant should apply accepted standards or any alternative method should be proposed and approved by the Ministry.
13	Which agencies or stakeholders are the main data owners and focal points?	The Ministry of Tourism and Environment
14	Will coordination be through one focal point or multiple institutions?	The Ministry will be the focal point of coordination.
15	Will the cleaned data be integrated into a national or regional database after completion?	To be decided.
16	Is there a preferred software or platform for analysis and visualization (e.g., Excel, Power BI, QGIS, Python, R)?	No specific preference
17	Are there templates or reporting formats for the inventory report?	The reporting template or format is expected to be agreed upon between the consultant and the Ministry following the award of the consultancy.
18	Should the outputs align with UNDP/GEF regional reporting frameworks?	The specified outputs and expected outcomes are aligned with the objectives of UNDP/GEF and the regional outcomes of the project.
19	I would also like to know the timeline for this report and expected awarding time.	The timeline for this consultancy aligns with the project schedule outlined in Section 5 of the TOR. Typically, the awarding process takes approximately 30 to 40 days. However, this duration may vary depending on unforeseen circumstances that could arise.
